Table Topics Contest

Contest Chair Script

Housekeeping rules

a. To minimize distractions to our contestants while competing, we ask you to consider the following:

- Avoid flash photography of the contestants during the contest. There will be photo opportunities later.

Timers, are you ready? Chief Judge, are the judges ready? Then we are ready to proceed with the Table Topics Contest.

Sergeant at Arms, please escort all contestants, except the first speaker, to a separate location, from which they will be escorted back for their turn.

—After all contestants have spoken—

We will have 2 minutes of silence for the Judges to finalize their score and rank the winner. Judges, please remember to finalize your scores and rank the contestants on the bottom portion of your ballot. When you are done, please tear off the bottom portion of your completed ballots, sign them and print your name in the appropriate locations, and hold them up for the counters.

While the Chief Judge and Ballot Counters leave the room to tally the ballots, it is time to get to know the contestants better. Let's give a warm welcome to our Contest

Announcement of results

Table Topics Contest

Chief Judge Script

Contestant Eligibility

1. It has been confirmed that all contestants are eligible. To be eligible a contestant must:
 - a. Be a Toastmaster in good standing of a club in good standing,
 - b. Not presently be an International, District or Area officer, nor have declared the intent to run for such offices.

Contest Procedures

- All contestants shall receive the same topic, which shall be of a general nature.
- The topic shall be of reasonable length, shall not require a detailed knowledge and should lead to an opinion or conclusion.
- Contestants may not use digital or other devices during the contest to gain an unfair advantage.
- All contestants will be escorted out of the room by the Sergeant at Arms except for the 1st contestant, and will be returned to the room one by one.
- The topic is then read to each contestant, who shall speak on that topic.
- Contestants may stay in the room after they have spoken.

Timing

- The time of the Table Topics Speech will be 1-2 minutes.
- Any speaker speaking less than 1:00 or more than 2:30 will be disqualified. The timing lights/cards will be activated as follows (ask the timekeepers to activate the lights/cardboards as you indicate timelines):
 - Green Light/Card at 1 minute
 - Yellow Light/Card at 1 minute and 30 seconds
 - Red Light/Card at 2:00, which will stay on until the speaker has finished speaking. No notice shall be given if a speaker goes over the time limit.

- Timing starts with the contestant's first definite verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience.

Judging

All judges have been briefed and are qualified to judge this contest.

There will be one minute of silence between speakers so the judges may complete their forms.

Protests

Protests are limited to eligibility and originality, and reference to another contestant's speech. Protests may be lodged only by the contestants or judges of this contest, to either the Chief Judge and/or Contest Chair, prior to the announcement of the contest results. Once the results have been announced, all decisions are final.

Humorous Speech Contest

Chief Judge's Script

Contestant Eligibility

1. It has been confirmed that all contestants are eligible. To be eligible a contestant must:
 - a. Be a Toastmaster in good standing of a club in good standing,
 - b. Not presently be an International, District or Area officer, nor have declared the intent to run for such offices.
2. All speeches are to be original, and quoted material so identified. No more than 25% of the speech may be devoted to quoting, paraphrasing, or referencing another person's content. Any non-original content must be identified during the speech presentation.
3. The speech must be thematic in nature (having an opening, body and closing) and must not be a monologue or series of one-liners.
4. Contestants may stay in the room during the contest.

Timing

- The time of the Humorous Speech Contest will be 5-7minutes
- Any speaker speaking less than 4 minutes and 30 seconds, or more than 7 minutes and 30 minutes will be disqualified.
- The timing lights/cards will be activated as follows (ask the timekeepers to activate the lights/cardboards as you indicate timelines):
- Green Light/Card will be displayed at 5:00 minutes
- Yellow Light/Card at 6:00 minutes and held up
- Red Light/Card will be displayed at 7:00 minutes and stay up until the speaker has finished speaking. No notice shall be given should a speaker go over time. Timing

starts with the contestant's first definite verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience.

Judging

All judges have been briefed and are qualified to judge this contest.

There will be one minute of silence between speakers so the judges may complete their forms.

Protests

Protests are limited to eligibility and originality, and reference to another contestant's speech. Protests may be lodged only by the contestants or judges of this contest, to either the Chief Judge and/or Contest Chair, prior to the announcement of the contest results. Once the results have been announced, all decisions are final.

International Speech Contest

Chief Judge's Script

Eligibility

It has been confirmed that all contestants are eligible. To be eligible a contestant must:

- a. Be a Toastmaster in good standing of a club in good standing,
- b. Have earned a DTM in the Legacy system or completed Levels 1 and 2 of any path in the Toastmasters Pathways education system.
- c. Not presently be an International, District or Area officer, nor have declared the intent to run for such offices.

Originality

- All speeches must be substantially original, and quoted material so identified. No more than 25% of the speech may be devoted to quoting, paraphrasing, or referencing another person's content. Any non-original content must be identified during the speech presentation. Speakers may not reference another contestant's speech.

- Speakers may stay in the room. Should they choose to leave the room during the contest, the Sergeant at Arms will escort contestants back into the room once their time to speak has arrived.

Timing

- The time of the International Speech Contest will be 5-7minutes

- Any speaker speaking less than 4 minutes and 30 seconds, or more than 7 minutes and 30 minutes will be disqualified.
- The timing lights/cards will be activated as follows (ask the timekeepers to activate the lights/cardboards as you indicate timelines):
- Green Light/Card will be displayed at 5:00 minutes
- Yellow Light/Card will be displayed at 6:00 minutes
- Red Light/Card will be displayed at 7:00 minutes and stay up until the speaker has finished speaking. No notice shall be given should a speaker go over time. Timing starts with the contestant's first definite verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience. Contestants are urged to make a definite ending to their speech so that the Timers know when to stop timing.

Protests are limited to eligibility and originality, and reference to another contestant's speech. Protests may be lodged only by the contestants or judges of this contest, to either the Chief Judge and/or Contest Chair, prior to the announcement of the contest results.
